## DPAC Meeting In Review - January 2023

Chair Report:

- DPAC Rep was interviewed about Uncertified Teachers Teaching On Call by the Vancouver Sun.
- The DPAC Chair \& member at large went to the BCCPAC DPAC Summit. The Workers' Advisers Office gave an overview of how the ministry uses data and the Framework for Enhancing Student Learning to improve student outcomes.
- The Learning Division for the Ministry of Education and Child Care shared support for parents regarding youth mental health, Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity inclusive education and
anti-racism actions. Anonymous reporting tool for students to report bullying Report it Erase. Presentation about the Ministry of Education \& Child Cares work towards Truth \& Reconciliation.
- Chilliwack/Surrey/Vancouver DPACs signed a letter to advocate to the new Premier to add 3 issues most affecting most our districts;
a. Align housing policy and planning with school planning
b. Restore life-cycle cost analysis for school facilities
c. Provide timely and equitable access to education for students with disabilities.

Trustee Report:

- DPAC's new liaison is Trustee Margaret Reid.
- The 2022-2023 Local School Calendar was approved as a result of the observed National Day of Mourning on September 19th , 2022 to commemorate the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II. Treasurer Report:
- Budgeting a surplus of approx. $\$ 2500$ in Gaming for the year, which will cover the additional proposed spending of $\$ 2152.50$ for Parent Presentation Events under Unfinished Business. NET Adjusted Bank Balance; Gaming Account: \$6,507.47, General Account: \$4,506.92.
Committee Reports:
- RCMP Safe Place Initiative: Do students/staff feel uneasy with RCMP? Could invite an officer to a meeting was discussed. Many don't feel safe, but could bridge the gap between communities.
- Sexuality \& Gender Equality Committee: To train the trainor contact dpacsecreatary@sd33.bc.ca. Unfinished Business:
- Shelley Moore is booked to present from approved funds, and will discuss inclusion and competency-based IEPs virtually on March 1 at 6 pm for up to 500 participants!
- May book Kim Barthel to present about understanding complex behaviors \& being your best self.
- Affordability Fund: How is that going for PACs? Some schools are providing gift cards, one bought students' glasses, another bought hot lunches for all. Some admins are struggling with how to determine if people need help. DPAC suggests: PAC's request Principle accounts for funds spent to ensure it is on time and done in a meaningful way.
- Uncertified Teachers Teaching On Call used due to not having enough TTOCs.
- Classes were being covered by 4-5 teachers being pulled in a day, creating inequity.
- Reportedly there are not college enough seats to train new certified teachers.
- The district has hired over 37 uncertified TTOCs already, and are following the Collective Agreement and School Act.
- Certified teachers get the opportunity to work first, uncertified TTOCs will not have positions past 20 days, are not unionized, and can be dismissed more easily.
- There is continued concern from parents \& DPAC about student safety, classroom preparedness, student behaviors and inadequate district training.
- Could improve the process for retired teachers, and late call out time (4am) so other districts don't get all the TTOCs the night before.
- Inclusive Playgrounds: DPAC hears there is no consultation with PACs regarding playground builds and upgrades. Principals should contact PACs about this. Funding continues to be an obstacle. DPAC may propose a playground policy and committee to the Board. If you are interested in inclusive playgrounds, please reach out to DPAC.

New Business:

- Emergency Preparedness is the sole responsibility of the district. There are Ministry endorsed best practices, but districts use the Emergency Management Planning Guide to provide support to schools in upholding their responsibilities during an emergency, more info. PACs are not responsible for purchasing or providing emergency equipment but can advocate the principal create a plan. Tips and tools for families, here. Stitos is new and didn't know what earthquake kits should contain. TMP - there is to be a plan provided by the pipeline company to each school within 500 m of pipeline. Schools can apply for a grant to get funding to help with supplies.
- How can DPAC help PACs with engaging parents? Suggested a DPAC newsletter would be helpful and material that helps educate parents/guardians with respect to DPAC and PACs roles and responsibilities and why parents should care. Can send PAC infoin the school newsletter, put a form link on PAC fb page, have parent info night with door prizes.
