School Co-Naming update: We are grateful for the contributions from our Soowahlie community for our school co-naming. Below are the four names that were offered, along with their meaning/story.

School Co-Naming suggestions:

- 1. sxíxets xó:tsa = forest lake
- 2. **slalakum** = water people
- 3. iliy'ethels = mouth of the river
- 4. *one more that we are finding the origin story for and will include in the survey

A survey will be going home this week asking for your vote on our new name: **Cultus Lake** _____ **Community School.** Survey will close at the end of April so that we can begin the next part of the process which will be designing a logo.

Through this project, we recognize the **First Peoples Principles of Learning**: Learning recognizes the role of Indigenous knowledge.

PBS Celebration of Beaver (<u>Sqelá:w</u>) – Beaver, <u>Sqelá:w</u> teaches us to work cooperatively to make the world a better place. We worked as a school to earn Navigator Notes for the month leading up to Spring Break. Our goal was to fill the jar with 200 Navigator Notes, so we could have our celebration. Just a reminder to our **Families of Grade 4 students** that you are invited to take the Student Learning Survey before the end of April.

It would be greatly appreciated if families could complete this survey as it gives feedback on curriculum, student learning and wellness, belonging and engagement.

To complete the survey:

- 1. Go to any computer that has an up-to-date internet browser access at home, work, or school. You are welcome to come to the school to do this.
- 2. Go to www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat survey/access.htm
- 3. Under the section Direct Access no logon number required select:
 - District: the name of your child's district
 - School: the name of your child's school
 - Language: the language of your choice
- 4. Complete the survey by clicking on the appropriate circle to answer each question. Move to the next set of questions by clicking on the right arrow in the bottom right corner of the screen. Click on the left arrow to navigate backwards.
- 5. When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".
- 6. Once complete, our school will have the results immediately.
